The port received a variety of feedback on the Alcoa-Evergreen purchase. Some concern was expressed over rail noise in downtown Vancouver. There was interest in our development of Parcel 8 and the expected grading process that is about to start. Generally positive feedback was received on the “Pay As You Grow” plan, the port’s environmental (Winter Solstice) update, and our electronic holiday card. An individual seeking a location for an indoor skate park inquired as to whether the port has empty warehouse space. Finally, details were provided to a member of the Vancouver

Wildlife league regarding the Parcel 6 wetland bank.

Community Meetings

The port presented at two neighborhood association meetings in December. Additionally, the port hosted a meeting with community stakeholders. The New “Pay-As-We-Grow” Plan was introduced at these meetings, along with port development plans.

Most feedback on port development and funding has been positive, with emphasis on the port’s commitment to fund future development without a tax increase. Fruit Valley neighbors are interested in the future of Parcels 7 and 8, due to the proximity to their neighborhood. Other issues included light rail impacts to the community and freight traffic on Fourth Plain Boulevard.

The port hosted a meeting with representatives from West Vancouver industrial businesses. The meeting focused on transportation projects affecting industries in the area, and included the Columbia River Crossing Project, and the City of Vancouver. The group was interested in freight access to I-5, the 39th Street overpass, and voiced concern about congestion between the lowlands and I-5.
