# CALL TO ORDER

Commission President Orange called a regular meeting of the Port of Vancouver Board of Commissioners to order and open to the public at 9:30 a.m., Tuesday, June 13, 2023, at the Port of Vancouver USA Administrative Office, 3103 NW Lower River Road, Vancouver, Washington 98660.

#### **OPENING REMARKS**

Commissioner Orange welcomed everyone to the commission meeting. He announced that the meeting is being recorded. He stated this meeting is a hybrid meeting so that along with everyone present in the meeting, anyone who wants to make virtual oral comment can use Zoom. He then invited guests to participate in the Pledge of Allegiance.

#### **APPROVAL OF MINUTES**

#### Regular Meeting of May 23, 2023

On motion by Commissioner Burkman, seconded by Commissioner LaBrant and carried unanimously, the Board of Commissioners approve the minutes of the May 23, 2023, regular meeting.

#### OPEN FORUM

Commissioner Orange stated that the agenda invited public comment and asked if anyone had signed up to speak. CEO Marler indicated no community members registered in advance to provide virtual oral comment and there was no one present who signed up to provide comment. She also announced that no executive session was held prior to the meeting.

# E-1 Approve 2023 Clark County Natural Hazard Mitigation Plan and Port of Vancouver USA Annex

Scott Ouchi, Safety, Risk, and Emergency Manager presented the action item and discussed it with the Commission. He answered questions from the Board.

On motion by Commissioner LaBrant, seconded by Commissioner Burkman, and carried unanimously, the Board of Commissioners authorize the CEO to approve the adoption of Volume 1 of the 2022/2023 Clark Regional Natural Hazard Mitigation Plan and the Port of Vancouver USA Annex (chapter 14 of Volume 2) of the Clark Regional Natural Hazard Mitigation Plan.

# E-2 Approve Public Works Contract Bid 23 – 11: Terminal 1 Dock Demolition

Greg Westrand, Project Manager presented the action item and discussed it with the Commission. He answered questions from the Board.

On motion by Commissioner Burkman, seconded by Commissioner LaBrant, and carried unanimously, the Board of Commissioners authorize the CEO to execute a public works contract with Advanced American Construction, the lowest responsive and responsible bidder, for Bid 23-11 Terminal 1 – Dock Demolition, in the amount of \$2,880,447.82 including Washington State sales tax.

SUBJECT:	Approve Third Amendment to Lease and Consent to Assignment Between the Port of Vancouver USA, NGL and Midstream Energy		

#### BACKGROUND:

This lease amendment and consent to assignment supports the port's Strategic Plan goals to strengthen the port's industrial business and strengthen its financial sustainability by utilizing the port's property and infrastructure investments to create jobs and support the local economy.

NGL Supply Terminal Company, LLC ("NGL") Lease began March 1, 2010 and its current term expires February 28, 2030, with one 10-year option to renew. The original Lessee was Keyera Energy Inc. The First Amendment to Lease was executed on February 25, 2014 to expand the Premises to add a fourth rail track and assign the Lease to NGL. The Second Amendment to Lease added butane as an approved commodity for transloading.

On February 2, 2023, NGL sent a notice to the port regarding their pending sale of their assets in Washington, including their terminal at the port, to Midstream Energy Partners (Washington) LTD ("Midstream") and requesting an assignment of the Lease. According to the Lease, any assignment to a third-party requires the approval of the port.

South 49 Holdings, LTD is the parent company of three subsidiaries in the USA, including Midstream. Midstream is a privately held company with ten terminal facilities and six storage locations in eight states and two Canadian provinces. Midstream's corporate headquarters is located in Calgary, Alberta, Canada. Midstream maintains a very high level of safety performance, regulatory compliance and operational experience.

Rent is \$10,992.97 per month plus leasehold excise taxes and additional charges. Lease security will be \$65,957.82, equivalent to six months' rent. Midstream will assume all responsibilities and obligations of the Lease, as Lessee. The effective date of the Lease assignment will be the closing date of the pending sale of the assets. All terms and conditions of the Lease will remain the same.

There will be no change in revenue in the port's 2023 budget.
