PORT OF VANCOUVER USA BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS REGULAR MEETING Tuesday, June 10, 2025

CALL TO ORDER

Commission President Burkman called a regular meeting of the Port of Vancouver Board of Commissioners to order and open to the public at 9:30 a.m., Tuesday, June 10, 2025, at the C-TRAN Administration Building, 10600 NE 51st Circle, Vancouver WA 98682.

OPENING REMARKS

Commissioner Burkman welcomed everyone to the commission meeting. He announced no executive session was held and that the meeting is being recorded. He stated that the meeting is being conducted in a hybrid format, allowing both in-person and virtual participation via Zoom for those wishing to provide oral comments. Commissioner Burkman then invited guests to participate in the Pledge of Allegiance.

APPROVAL OF MINUTES

Regular Meeting of May 27, 2025

On motion by Commissioner LaBrant, seconded by Commissioner Orange, and carried unanimously, the Board of Commissioners approve the minutes of the May 27, 2025 regular meeting.

OPEN FORUM

Commissioner Burkman asked if anyone had signed up to speak during open forum. CEO Marler stated no one signed up in advance to provide virtual oral comments and confirmed that there was no one present who signed up to provide comment.

ACTION ITEMS

E-1 Approve First Amendment to Lease between the Port of Vancouver USA and Vancouver Bulk Terminal LLC

Angie Hanslovan, Real Estate Specialist, presented the action item and discussed it with the commissioners.

On motion by Commissioner LaBrant, seconded by Commissioner Orange, and carried unanimously, the Board of Commissioners approve and authorize the CEO to execute the First Amendment to Lease at 2701 NW Harborside Drive between the Port of Vancouver USA and Vancouver Bulk Terminal LLC.

E-2 Approve Raj Chemicals Americas LLC Accounts Receivable Write-off

Scott Goodrich, Chief Financial Officer, presented the action item and discussed it with the commissioners.

On motion by Commissioner LaBrant, seconded by Commissioner Orange, and carried unanimously, the Board of Commissioners approve the write-off of \$136,496.06 from the aged accounts receivable for Raj Chemicals Americas, LLC.

E-3 Approve the Sale of Surplus Equipment

Casey O'Dell, Director of Facilities, presented the action item and discussed it with the commissioners.

On motion by Commissioner LaBrant, seconded by Commissioner Orange, and carried unanimously, the Board of Commissioners authorize the CEO to approve the sale of the surplus equipment for \$37,500 and affirm that the CEO acted within the intent of the policy and based on reliable market information available at the time of approval.

SUBJECT:	Approve Public Works Contract for Bid 25-14: Berth 13 and 14 Improvements		

BACKGROUND:

This agenda item supports the port's Strategic Plan goal of pursuing opportunities that utilize the port's property and infrastructure investments to create jobs and support the economy.

Berths 13 and 14 at Terminal 4 have been historically used for short-term lay berth of cargo and military vessels, as well as container storage in the upland parking area. The lack of parking space and the vessels' sewage discharge system make these berths less appealing for long-term use as lay berths. If approved, this project will modernize these Berths by rehabilitating the existing asphalt roadway, expanding the parking area to accommodate 40 vehicles, installing site lighting, adding a sewage pump that connects the vessel to sanitary discharge with a dedicated pump house, and upgrading the security fence with a gate.

Berth 13 & 14 Improvements project is anticipated to be completed by end of October 2025.

On May 15, 2025, the Port of Vancouver issued an Invitation to Bid 25-14: Berth 13 and 14 Improvements. On June 12, 2025, the following bids were received:

Staff has reviewed Western United Civil's responsive bid and concluded they are a responsible contractor cable of performing the work. The bid is below the engineer's estimate range of \$1,574,801 ~ \$1,740,569.

The project is included in the approved annual budget.
