# CALL TO ORDER

Commission Vice-President Orange called a regular meeting of the Port of Vancouver Board of Commissioners to order and open to the public at 9:30 a.m., Tuesday, July 8, 2025, at the C-TRAN Administration Building, 10600 NE 51st Circle, Vancouver WA 98682.

### **OPENING REMARKS**

Commissioner Orange welcomed everyone to the commission meeting. He announced no executive session was held and that the meeting is being recorded. He also informed attendees that Commissioner Burkman would be delayed but would be in attendance. He stated that the meeting is being conducted in a hybrid format, allowing both in-person and virtual participation via Zoom for those wishing to provide oral comments. Commissioner Orange then invited guests to participate in the Pledge of Allegiance.

# **CELEBRATE FREEDOM PROGRAM**

Temple Lentz, President/CEO of the Historic Trust provided an update on 2025 Celebrate Freedom programs, including the Marshall Leadership Awards, a reimagined summer event series, and the Veterans Day Parade. She expressed appreciation for the port's continued support and shared progress on the new small business incubator program.

The commissioners thanked Temple Lentz for her presentation and for her efforts in sharing Vancouver's history.

# E-1 Approve Public Works Contract for Bid 25-26: Building 3103 North Office Renovations

Josh Pope, Project Manager, presented the action item and discussed it with the commissioners.

On motion by Commissioner LaBrant, seconded by Commissioner Orange, and carried unanimously, the Board of Commissioners authorize the CEO to execute a public works contract with Kirby Nagelhout Construction Company, the lowest responsive and responsible bidder, for Bid 25-26: Building 3103 North Office Renovations, for the base bid plus the additive alternate of \$1,054,063.00 plus applicable Washington State sales tax.

#### BACKGROUND:

This project supports the port's strategic plan goals by leveraging property and infrastructure to create jobs, support the economy, and maintain a diverse cargo portfolio. It promotes growth for existing tenants while protecting air, water, and land through proactive, sustainable operations.

This project supports a tenant facility improvement by removing contaminated soil from the construction area and transporting it to a regulated landfill for appropriate disposal. The port is responsible for coordinating this portion of the work in accordance with the lease agreement.

The contractor will provide trucking services on an as needed basis for the duration of the project. The contract is anticipated to be completed in October 2026.

On June 13, 2025, the port issued Invitation to Bid 25-34: Building 2695 Trucking project. On July 14, 2025, the following bids were received:

Staff have reviewed Nutter Corporation's responsive bid and concluded they are a responsible contractor capable of performing the work.

The engineer's estimate is \$747,208.00 to \$828,862.00. The project is included in the approved 2025 budget.
