

## PORT HAPPENINGS

#### **POV FAST FACTS**

- The port has 850 acres of developed industrial and marine property and more than 600 acres of land for future development.
- The port is home to more than 50 business tenants with a diverse portfolio of manufacturing, industrial activity and more.



#### >>> MAY HIGHLIGHTS

- The port put shovel to dirt in May, kicking off the transformation of the port's Berth 7 into a state-of-the-art facility for a U.S. sourced mineral - soda ash. By late 2026, the port will be a key global outlet for this mineral
- Commissioners awarded Advanced Excavating Specialist from Kelso,
   Washington the construction contract to extend the bike and pedestrian pathway along NW Lower River Road
- Commissioners approved a 5-year lease with Cascadia Tech Academy for their one-year Maritime Technology program designed for up to 40 students. The location offers students direct visibility and close proximity to waterfront and rail operations

#### WHAT'S NEW IN JUNE <

- The port administrative office is currently under construction for a planned renovation. A new roof will be installed along with HVAC and lighting upgrades. Work is expected to continue through the rest of 2025
- Due to the renovation, Commission meetings will temporarily be moved to the C-TRAN Board Room (10600 NE 51st Circle, Vancouver 98682)
- The temporary location for port public resources is 2801 NW Lower River Road, within the Plastics Northwest building
- The port is seeking bids for the Berth 13 and 14 Improvements project which will renovate and improve the existing berth facilities located on Terminal 4. Engineer's Estimate is \$1,574,801 ~ \$1,740,569. Bids are due June 12th at 2:00 pm





#### >>> JUNE VESSEL ACTIVITY

- . One grain ship is scheduled to be loaded this wee
- We will unload four Subaru ships this month
- Three ULSD ships will be loaded this month totaling 66,000 bbls
- We will receive almost 4,000 LMT of sodium hydroxide this month
- . 16,000 metric tons of copper will be loaded this month on two ships
- Nearly 3,500 MT of aluminum products will arrive in June
- · 22,000 bbls of jet fuel will be loaded this month in one shipment
- An additional liquid bulk ship will be loaded with 22,000 bbls of B5
- · A shipment of transformers will arrive later this month






